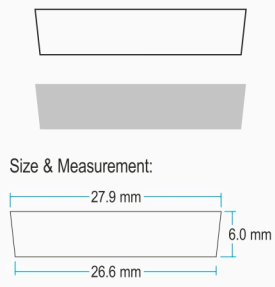
### WINDSHIELD TEMPLATE

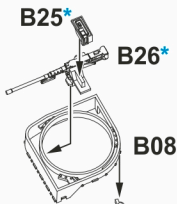
The lights on the M3 are on top of the fender. Remove lights on the armoured ventilation compartment with a sharp knife.



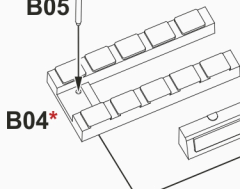

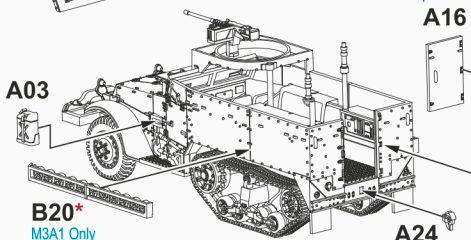
**HISTORICAL FACTS:** The Carrier, Personnel Half Track M3, also known as the M3 Half Track, was an American armoured personnel carrier widely used by the Allies during World War Two and into the Cold War. Derived from the M2 Half Track Car, the slightly longer M3 was extensively produced, with over **41,000** units were manufactured. The M3 and its variants were supplied to the US Army and Marines, as well as British Commonwealth and Soviet Red Army forces, serving on all major fronts throughout the war. The **M3A1** had the improved M49 machine gun mount over the right hand front seat. Between 1942 and 1943 all M3 Half-Tracks (standard and A1s) were continually upgraded. These improvements included a number of drive train, engine, and stowage improvements.
