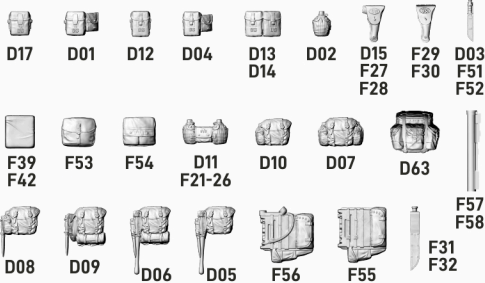

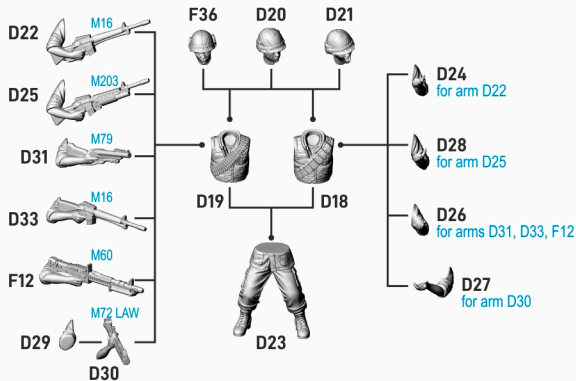
Sample Figures with Various Accessories



FACTS: US Army and Marine Corps gear was intermingled throughout the Vietnam War. Equipment was not often issued in matched or complete sets. For example, Marine Corps M1941 equipment had been replaced by Army M1956 Load Carrying Equipment (LCE), and later M1967 Modernized Load Carrying Equipment (MLCE).

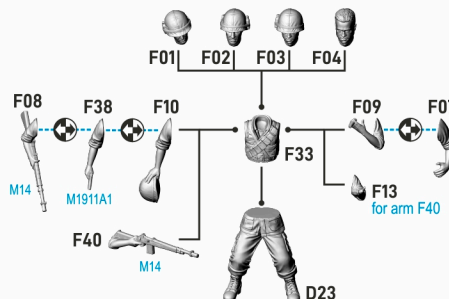

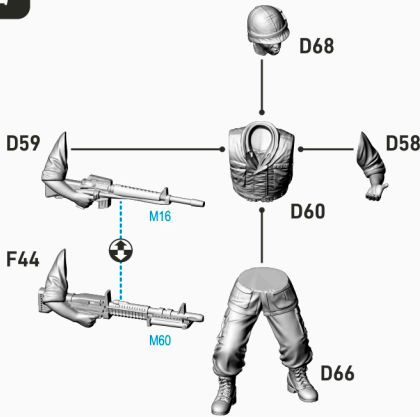
Command Options

FACTS: Marines each had a M7 bayonet knife and scabbard for an M16 to serve as a general close combat purposes. A 12-inch all steel, Bowie-style "Ka-Bar" knife was issued to everyone who carried a pistol, including MG gunners, grenadiers, corpsmen, officers and NCOs. Most Marines wore them on the left side of their pistol belt.



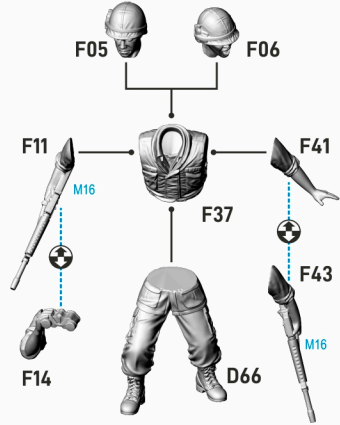

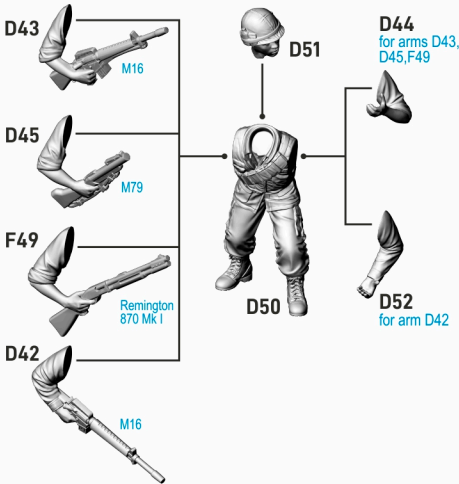
FACTS: Marines often carried seven 20-round M16 mags in their M3 bandoleers. Grenade-launcher 40mm rounds and grenades were alternatively carried in the M3's pockets. M60 machine gun 100-round disintegrating metallic linked belts were issued as carton in rectangular M4 bandoleer. They were easier to carry slung across the chest but were subject to dirt and wastage.

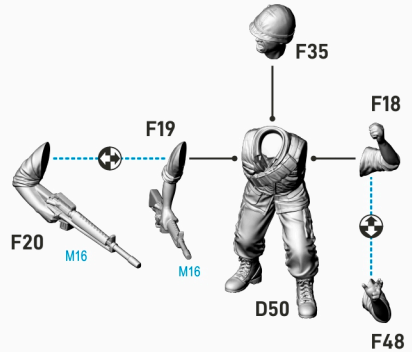

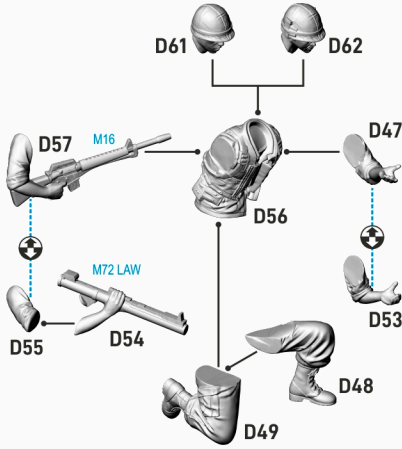


Our **Viet Cong Fighters** (281001) plastic figure box set is an excellent choice for pitching battles. The box contains both male and female fighters with options to build command squads.

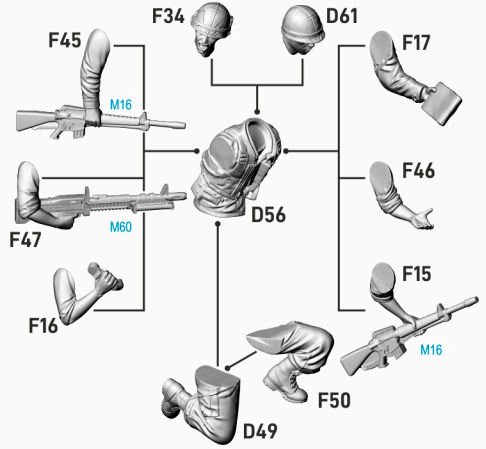

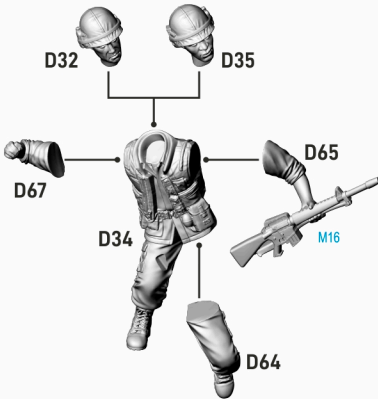

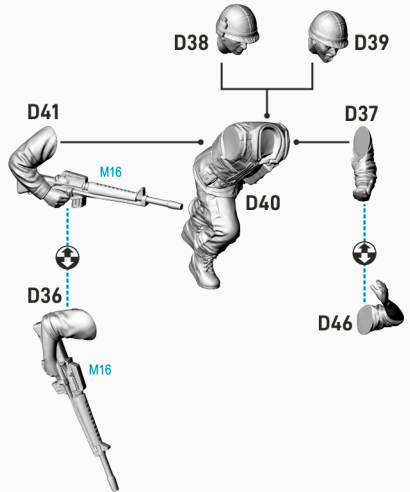
